Seneca Lake

Location:
 Seneca Lake is located in Guernsey and Noble counties near Cambridge, Ohio and is accessible by I-70 and I-77.

History:
 Seneca Dam was constructed in 1937 on the Seneca Fork of Wills Creek for the purpose of flood control. The Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District (MWCD) owns the lake and surrounding land, and is responsible for managing conservation and recreational activities. The dam is owned by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE).

Licenses:
 State licenses are required by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources for boating, fishing, and hunting.

Boat Launching:
 One public boat launch ramp is located on Seneca Lake near the rest area off St. Rt. 313.

Fishing:
 Seneca Lake is home to bluegill, bullheads, channel catfish, crappie, flathead catfish, largemouth bass, striped bass, walleye, white bass, and yellow perch.

Hunting:
 Hunting and trapping on MWCD land is regulated by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Division of Wildlife, which issues a publication detailing Ohio hunting and trapping regulations. To request this publication, please contact the Division of Wildlife or pick one up at the MWCD main office in New Philadelphia. In the interest of safety, hunting on MWCD land is prohibited within 500 feet of "restricted use" areas, buildings, and public roads.
